**Town of Farmington Conservation Commission**

**1. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. by Chairman Hinze.

**2. New Business**

Eversource

The Commission reviewed the scheduled maintenance activities submitted by Eversource for 2016. After a brief discussion the Commissioners asked Town Staff to ask Eversource to submit mapping that includes wetlands.

65 Burnt Hill Road

Joseph Green, P.E., Robert Green Associates, briefly explained the proposed re-subdivision of 65 Burnt Hill Road to create one additional lot. Mr. Green talked about the history of the adjoining 65 acre parcel currently owned by the Town of Farmington. The subject of the Conservation Commissions review is a strip of land to be deeded to the Town at the end of the cul-de-sac if the subdivision is approved by the Town Plan & Zoning Commission. There was a brief discussion of the proposed access and the history of the property.

Upon a motion made and seconded (Wolf/Isner) it was unanimously

VOTED: To forward their recommendation to the Town Plan and Zoning Commission of support of the acceptance of the open space in lieu of a conservation easement if the Leslie Rock re-subdivision of 65 Burnt Hill Road is approved and that the proposed open space area be denoted with property markers/pins.
