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Town of Farmington Announces Tax Deferment Program to Assist Residents and Businesses Affected by COVID-19

FARMINGTON, CT- On Tuesday, April 21, 2020 the Farmington Town Council unanimously approved a Tax Deferment program for taxpayers and businesses adversely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Under this program, eligible taxpayers, businesses, nonprofits, and residents can obtain a deferment of three months on any taxes on real property, personal property or motor vehicles, sewer and waste charges and assessments that are levied between April 1, 2020 and July 1, 2020 For example, payment on taxes normally due on July 1, 2020, can be deferred until October 1, 2020 without penalty.

Eligible taxpayers, businesses, nonprofits, and residents are those that attest to or document to the Town of Farmington, that they have experienced significant adverse economic impact due to COVID-19 and/or those that document they are providing relief to those significantly negatively affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

“This deferment program is the best way to assist Farmington residents and taxpayers who have been financially affected by COVID-19,” said C.J. Thomas, Town Council Chair.
